



2019 LAURIE D. ZELON PRO BONO AWARD

RICARDO A. ANZALDÚA and FREDDIE MAC'S LEGAL DIVISION



PBI is proud to present its 2019 Laurie D. Zelon Pro Bono Award to the Legal Division of Freddie Mac and Ricardo A. Anzaldúa, Freddie Mac's Executive Vice President, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary. PBI created the Zelon Award to honor those who, like Justice Zelon, demonstrate leadership and extraordinary contributions to enhancing justice for all.

Headquartered in McLean, Virginia, Freddie Mac began its formal pro bono efforts more than 25 years ago, when it partnered with Legal Services of Northern Virginia (LSNV) to serve disadvantaged populations. Since then, Freddie Mac's Legal Division has partnered with numerous local and regional community organizations and initiatives in the Northern Virginia area to provide extensive pro bono services in addition to its continuing pro bono relationship with LSNV, including projects with Capital Area Immigrants' Rights Coalition (CAIR), Fairfax Court Appointed Special Advocates, Tahirih Justice Center, and Whitman-Walker Health Legal Services, among others. The Pro Bono Program includes a broad array of projects serving individuals, hosting numerous pro bono clinics at Freddie Mac's headquarters, providing corporate legal services to nonprofit organizations, and successfully litigating more than a dozen complex asylum and related immigration matters.

Ricardo A. Anzaldúa became Freddie Mac's general counsel in January 2019, overseeing all legal and regulatory strategies, services, resources, and corporate governance matters. In this new role, Anzaldúa continues his longtime commitment to pro bono legal services, which began as a student at Harvard Law School where he worked on pro bono asylum cases.

Over the years, Freddie Mac's Legal Division has evaluated its pro bono program regularly to ensure that it continues to thrive by adapting to the changing needs and interests of its staff and partner organizations and prioritizing the needs of its local community. A Corporate Pro Bono (CPBO) Challenge® signatory, Freddie Mac engages more than 60 percent of its Legal Division employees in pro bono.

"American lawyers have long understood that we have a duty as officers of the justice system to provide no-cost legal services to our neighbors who cannot afford to pay even discounted legal fees," said Anzaldúa. "Freddie Mac's Legal Division is inclusive in encouraging all legal division employees to contribute to delivering pro bono legal services. I am proud of the service of the Freddie Mac Legal Division, lawyers and support staff alike, who have been meeting our benchmarks for pro bono, and I will continue to encourage all to participate."

Notably, since 2014, Freddie Mac legal teams have successfully represented 12 immigrants detained in Virginia and Maryland and four juvenile immigrants seeking special visas to remain in the United States, devoting more than 2,000 hours to pro bono legal services through the division's partnership with CAIR, a D.C.-based nonprofit organization that represents adult and juvenile immigrants at risk of detention and deportation.

The award is presented each year to an individual or organization that has provided exemplary pro bono service. It honors the legal leadership of Associate Justice of the California Court of Appeal Laurie D. Zelon, who was one of the originators of the Law Firm Pro Bono Challenge® initiative. Justice Zelon is a long-time member of the California Commission on Access to Justice and has served as its chair. She is an active member of several statewide judicial committees addressing administration of justice issues.

CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION (CLE) CREDIT FAQS

Q. How do I get CLE credit for my attendance?

A. There is a CLE table near the PBI 2019 Conference Registration Desk with information about obtaining CLE credit. Some states require attorneys to sign in and out each day, so, as a precaution, we recommend all attendees sign in and out each day. Following the event, attendance must be requested through our online affidavit form at www.probonoinst org/conference/CLE, which will remain open for requests for 14 days after the event.

You must complete the online affidavit by Friday, April 12, 2019 to be eligible to receive CLE credit.

Q: When will I receive my CLE credit?

A. If you complete the affidavit by the deadline, a certificate of completion will be issued within 30 days of your submission. The certificate will be issued by West LegalEdcenter, and an email from onlinecle@westlegaledcenter.com will be sent with instructions to download the certificate.

Q: Where is CLE credit for the PBI Conference available?

LAW FIRM PRO BONO CHALLENGE® STATEMENT

Recognizing the growing severity of the unmet legal needs of the poor and disadvantaged in the communities we serve, and mindful that major law firms must – in the finest traditions of our profession – play a leading role in addressing these unmet needs, our firm is pleased to join with other firms across the country in subscribing to the following statement of principles and in pledging our best efforts to achieve the voluntary goals described below.

- 1. Our firm recognizes its institutional obligation to encourage and support the participation by all of its attorneys in pro bono publico activities. We agree to promulgate and maintain a clearly articulated and commonly understood firm policy which unequivocally states the firm's commitment to pro bono work.
- 2. To underscore our institutional commitment to pro bono activities, we agree to use our best efforts to ensure that, by no later than the close of the calendar year, our firm will either:
 - (1) annually contribute, at a minimum, an amount of time equal to 5 percent of the firm's total billable hours or 100 hours per attorney to pro bono work; or
 - (2) annually contribute, at a minimum, an amount of time equal to 3 percent of the firm's total billable hours or 60 hours per attorney to pro bono work.
- 3. In recognition of the special needs of the poor for legal services, we believe that our firm's pro bono activities should be particularly focused on providing access to the justice system for persons otherwise unable to afford it. Accordingly, in meeting the voluntary goals described above, we agree that a majority of the minimum pro bono time contributed by our firm should consist of the delivery of legal services on a pro bono basis to persons of limited means or to charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental, and educational organizations in matters which are designed primarily to address the needs of persons of limited means.
- 4. Recognizing that broad-based participation in pro bono activities is desirable, our firm agrees that, in meeting the minimum goals described above, we will use our best efforts to ensure that a majority of both partners and associates in the firm participate annually in pro bono activities.
- 5. In furtherance of these principles, our firm also agrees:
 - a. To provide a broad range of pro bono opportunities, training, and supervision to attorneys in the firm, to ensure that all of our attorneys can avail themselves of the opportunity to do pro bono work;
 - b. To ensure that the firm's policies with respect to evaluation, advancement, productivity, and compensation of its attorneys are compatible with the firm's strong commitment to encourage and support substantial pro bono participation by all attorneys; and
 - c. To monitor the firm's progress toward the goals established in this statement and to report its progress annually to the members of the firm and to the Law Firm Pro Bono Project.
- 6. This firm also recognizes the obligation of major law firms to contribute financial support to organizations that provide legal services free of charge to persons of limited means.



7. As used in this statement, the term pro bono refers to activities of the firm undertaken normally without expectation of fee and not in the course of ordinary commercial practice and consisting of (i) the delivery of legal services to persons of limited means or to charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental, and educational organizations in matters which are designed primarily to address the needs of persons of limited means; (ii) the provision of legal assistance to individuals, groups, or organizations seeking to secure or protect civil rights, civil liberties, or public rights; and (iii) the provision of legal assistance to charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental, or educational organizations in matters in furtherance of their organizational purposes, where the payment of standard legal fees would significantly deplete the organization's economic resources or would be otherwise inappropriate.



Clinic in a Box® Program – Legal Education: This model provides in-house counsel the opportunity to educate nonprofit organizations or small businesses on select legal topics, answer questions, and provide brief advice.
